



## ENDANGERED SPECIES AUSTRALIA—COLOURING COMPETITION

This colouring competition is designed to increase awareness of the extent and impact of human activities on the unique and special flora (plants) and fauna (animals) in Australia. Iconic species like the Koala are facing land clearing and habitat loss and represent a massive number of the plants and animals threatened by extinction in Australia. Climate change, mining, agriculture, urbanisation and habitat destruction are key threats. The loss of species may be abrupt and rapid. The conservation efforts may be too little or too late as with the Grey's Wallaby approximately 100 years ago when critical swamp ecosystems were destroyed.

All 1st place winners and 2nd place runners-up in each of the three age classes: Under 5 years; 6-12 years and over 12 years including adults will receive a prize; either a board game, book or soft toy.
